Support Children and Adults with Down syndrome!

DSA is a non-profit organization (EIN#33-0220955) affiliated with the National Down Syndrome Society, the National Down Syndrome Congress and the Exceptional Family Resource Center. Charitable Contributions are used to support vital programs that enrich the lives of people with Down syndrome and their families.

Ensure new and expectant parents receive the DSA New Parent Kit, which includes a book, informational video and resources to assist parents as they begin their journey. The estimated cost for each kit is \$75. Volunteers donate time to assemble and deliver materials to families and hospitals.

Support education for parents and professionals. DSA hosts an annual symposium which focuses on health care and/or education. Experts in the field present on a variety of topics which link research, policy and practice. The goal is to empower families and professionals with information and resources to improve the quality of care, treatment and outcomes.

Support Literacy for people with Down syndrome. Plans are underway to launch a model reading and language intervention program, which enhances and promotes literacy – reading, speech, language and communication (oral and written expression) skills.
